## Outcome of this CME

Fever is the commonest presenting complaint that clinicians face in practice. Though it is well known that fever alone doesn't cause any injury to the child except perhaps in cases of heat stroke and febrile status epileptics but still it is a cause of parental worry. Many times this is either treated with unnecessary antiblotics or put to unwarranted investigation. Hence, it is extremely important to recognize significant fever that requires urgent attention. This CME helped all the delegates to gain a concise and accurate approach to fever. Specifically, outcome can be described: For PG students - Students became acquainted with basics of fever, common assoclated presenting complaints and approach to different patients. They became well versed with required history taking and clinical examination. They learned about emergency management of various accompanying complications. Well - designed presentations by the faculty helped students attain great amount of knowledge in a short span of time.
For Faculty and Private Practitioners - Aside from revision of basic concepts, the CME helped them understand the value of relevant investigations and rational drug usage. With the ever increasing incidence of drug resistance, such upto date knowledge of protocols and guidelines is the need of the hour for all pediatricians. Demonstration of successful outcome even in complicated cases by the faculty was definitely inspiring to all other practitioners among the delegates.

1. LOW BACK PAIN: THE PRICE FOR YOUR ERECT POSTURE: DR. R GUNAKI PROFESSOR, DEPARTMENT OF ORTHOPAEDICS, KRISHNA HOSPITAL, KARAD.

The lecture focused on conservative management of subjects with myocardial infacrtion of all the stages within ICU setup. Various techniques which can be performed in ICU setup on subjects with the condition were elaborated and discussed along with evidence. DR. JAVID. H. SAGR, PROFESSOR, KRISHNA COLLEGE OF PHYSIOTHERAPY, KIMSDU, KARAD.
The session briefed about the physiotherapy skills in OPD set-up which can be utilized to treat subjects with post-operative myocardial infarction. Techniques like segmental and diaphragmatic breathing were more focused and their importance in post-operative cases were discussed.

The lecture focused on cardiac rehabilitation of subjects with myocardial infarction. All the phases of cardiac rehabilitation were discussed in detail with emphasis on team work which is proved effective in treating cardiac patients.

## Research Methodology $8^{\text {th }}$ to $12^{\text {th }}$ October 2018

Directorate of Research, Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences, "Deemed To Be University", Karad scheduled Workshop in Research Methodology for Postgraduate Students from Faculty of Medicine, Nursing, Dental, Physiotherapy, and for PhD. Students.

# Workshop <br> Hands - on Workshop on WHONET \& Baclink 

## $6^{\text {th }} \& 7^{\text {th }}$ February 2019

Hands - on Workshop on WHONET and Baclink was conducted as an activity by Staff Scientific Society \& Department of Microbiology at MET Hall KIMS, Karad on the $6^{\text {th }} \& 7^{\text {th }}$ February 2019.

WHONET is a free windows - based desktop application developed by the WHO Collaborating Centre for surveillance of Antimicrobial Resistance for the laboratory - based surveillance of infectious diseases and antimicrobial resistance.

The principal goals of the software are:

- To enhance capabilities for analyzing laboratory data; and
- To promote national and international collaboration through the exchange of data.

Baclink is a software for the conversion and standardization of microbiology data from existing systems into WHONET. Data can be converted on a weekly, monthly, or ad hoc basis, or in a number of institutions, it has also been possible to automate and schedule the entire process. Both WHONET and Baclink are available free - of - charge from the World Health Organization website.

By converting data to WHONET, laboratories have the benefits of :

1. Flexible data analysis capabilities; and 2. The ability to share data with other laboratories, for example in a national surveillance network.

A key priority for tackling antimicrobial resistance is establishing effective surveillance systems for antimicrobial resistance. There are various hospital laboratories in the country that are testing for antimicrobial resistance. However, the data analysis and sharing is a problem due to multiple data systems.

WHONET is a great tool which can provide same data sharing platform across all laboratories.

To achieve this capacity building, a 2 days Hands - on Workshop was organized to strengthen the national capacity for using WHONET for AMR data collation and analysis.


The goals of the Workshop were:

1. Impart knowledge and skill for using WHONET and Baclink
2. Share WHONET user experiences and lessons learnt.
3. Provide hands - on detailed training on WHONET data entry, data importation, configuration, and management for AMR surveillance.

The resource person for this workshop were Dr. Sonal Saxena Director Professor. Department of Microbiology, LHMC, New Delhi and Dr. Poonam Loomba Director Professor. Department of Microbiology, G. B. Pant Hospital, New Delhi

This 2 day workshop program was inaugurated at the hands of Dr. S. T. Mohite Principal, KIMS and Dr. A. Y. Kshirsagar, Medical Director KH\&MRC, Karad.

The total participants enrolled for this workshop was about 18. Each participant was involved individually by operating on their own laptop. The workshop was fruitful with a rewarding outcome.

It ended with a valedictory function for which the past President IAMM. Dr. Abhay Chowdhary, in his presence enlightened on the importance of AMR and handed over the Certificate of Participation in the workshop to all the participants.

The entire training was divided into three sessions as below:

Syringe driver, also known as a syringe pump, is a small infusion pump, used to gradually administer small amounts of fluid (with or without medication) to a patient. Infusion pump is a medical device that delivers fluids, such as nutrients and medications, into a patient's body in controlled amounts.

Infusion pump draws fluid from a standard bag of intravenous fluid and controls the rate of flow. Because syringe pumps contain a maximum volume of 50 ml , syringe pumps are used to administer medications that have very small hourly volumes (for example, usually less than $5 \mathrm{ml} / \mathrm{hr}$ ).
